"Coming of Age in the 20th Century: Memoirs of American Girlhood" with Nicole Stamant, Fuller E. Callaway Professor of English

In the twentieth century, from the 1940s to the 1990s, the number of books published as autobiography or memoir tripled. "Suddenly, it would seem," Leigh Gilmore writes, "memoir has become the genre in the skittish period around the turn of the millennium"; such an increase remains unabated post-millennium, too-in his examination of the cultural history of memoir, Ben Yagoda points out that sales of memoirs increased by more than 400% from 2004-2008 alone. In the decade since, it has become commonplace to consider the production of identities and subjectivities across narrative spheres and histories: from older forms (like captivity narratives, narratives of enslavement, and commonplace books) to contemporary iterations in memoir, blogs, social media, and reality television, it is obvious that literary life writing matters. Life narratives demand that readers attend to histories, lives, languages, and experiences that are often unfamiliar or different from their own. Reading self-representational texts raises questions about ethics, veracity, memory, and subjectivity, and we will explore these issues and others as we examine how life writers, in America and transnationally, understand and represent selfhood, addressing inherent implications of reading stories of others' lives.
